### Medical Marijuana Edibles Maker

- **GENERAL:** As part of a team of 8, my work (part time, 2 days per week) is focused on creating high quality medical marijuana edible candies for licensed patients in the state of Maine.
- **DUTIES:** Prepare and then properly dose all active ingredients (THC, RSO, Hash, CBD) used in the creation of medical marijuana edible candies, prepare all of the food related ingredients used to create the candy element of the medical marijuana candies, Cook 20-40 batches of medical marijuana edible candies for custom orders or general wholesale orders, and clean and maintain a commercial kitchen.

- **GENERAL:** Oversaw the day to day management/operations and long term development of a community library that served 20,000+ residents in 7 regional towns.
- **STRATEGIC PLANNING:** Researched, prepared, presented, and implemented goals, policies, and plan for the improvement & growth of the library with a 7 member Board of Trustees.
- **MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT:** Served as a Department Head for the City of Gardiner, working in a Local Municipal Government environment with a City Council.
- **BUDGETS & FINANCE:** Developed, prepared, and managed a budget of over \$500,00 USD. In the Fiscal year of 22-23 I developed and advocated for a budget increase of \$30k highlighting key areas of necessary improvements including salaries, benefits, and library resources. The budget was unanimously approved by the Gardiner City Council.
- **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:** Built and maintained relationships with residents and politicians of partner towns who receive library services as well as other local organizations, schools, businesses, and more.
- **HUMAN RESOURCES:** Managed 8 employees (4 full time, 4 part time).
- **GRANT WRITING:** As the Library Director one of my major focuses was writing, managing, and finalizing grants aimed at improving library services and the library building & grounds. To help make this work as successful as possible, I initiated and grew relationships with local foundations and grant making

agencies so that our library was well known to these funders.

- **MARKETING & PROMOTION:** Promoted library services and happenings through social media, outreach, and presentations.
- **TECHNOLOGY:** Used the open source content management system Wordpress to manage the library's website. In my time at this library, I focused my efforts on website redesign in order to make all of the information found on the website more easily accessible for community members.
- **NON-PROFIT BOARDS:** Worked directly with the 14 member Gardiner Library Association Board of Directors to maintain the library building & grounds and also improve library services.

#### Team Leader: Libraries & Community Spaces, Northern Suburbs

October 2019 - November 2021

##### Wellington City Libraries

- **GENERAL:** Provided strategic direction and leadership for 2 public libraries and 4 community centers in the capital city of New Zealand
- **HUMAN RESOURCES:** Management of 36 employees including two direct line managers, 3 specialist librarians, and 31 front facing library customer service staff.
- **LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT:** Oversaw the operation of the Johnsonville Library at Waitohi Community Hub, a community space that includes not only a library but a swimming pool, a community centre, a café, and a kindergarden. Opened in December 2019, the overall library business grew by 120% in the first 15 months. Served as a member of the Library Leadership Team, a group of 7 staff members who strategically guided the operation and growth of the Wellington City Libraries.
- **LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT:** Established & provided strategic direction for THE HIVE, Wellington City Libraries' first makerspace. With this space, I led the team in developing their day to day planning, overall structure, and back-end reporting. I also served as a member of a team which focused on strategic planning for the reopening of Wellington's Central Library. This \$150 million dollar project was focused on developing new library services, operations, and partnerships for the library, scheduled to open in 2026.
- **TECHNOLOGY:** Served as a member of the Library Technology Portfolio with a focus on Makerspaces, People Counters, and Community Room Booking Systems. I led a highly successful collaboration with a local company named Bellwether to install people counting systems in 30+ Wellington City Libraries & Community Centres. These people counting systems allowed the entire library system to monitor the amount of community members visiting and utilizing these spaces.
- **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:** Served as a key member of the Linden Working Group, which was focused on community development in a vastly underserved area of Wellington, New Zealand. This group had a specific focus on developing and expanding services at the Linden Community Centre, a site which I managed.
- **ORGANIZATIONAL REFORM:** Focused on implementing a workplace change management program to reshape the team's library and community spaces work culture.
- **BUDGETS & FINANCE:** Managed a fiscal year budget of \$1 million NZD for seven locations in the northern suburbs of Wellington, New Zealand.

#### Executive Director

##### Benson Memorial Library

- **GENERAL:** Successfully led a team of 8 staff members in the daily management/operations a rural public library that served 15,000+ community members. Worked with a 7 member non-profit Board of Directors on all aspects of long term planning for the library including building maintenance and endowment management.
- **STRATEGIC PLANNING:** Developed a future focused strategic vision, accepted by the Library governance board, to guide the library's direction for the next 5-10 years.
- **GRANT WRITING:** Actively initiated and sustained successful relationships with local foundations and grant making agencies. In my 4 years as Executive Director, I secured \$159,000 in additional funding to grow services and maintain the library building through grants and private donors.
- **ORGANIZATIONAL REFORM:** Embarked on an ambitious modernization of library policies and procedures as well as a workplace change management program whose goal was to reshape the library's culture into one that was focused on community first. These changes resulted in modern library services that can have been individualized for the community. As a result there was an increase in total library business by 8% in 2016 and 3% in 2017.

- **LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT:** Created the position of Historian at the Benson Memorial Library, a full time role who provided local residents with access to quality information about the community's local history and assisting individuals with genealogical research.
- **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:** Developed highly successful relationships with local community organizations, schools, and service organizations. By developing these relationships, I was able to identify their needs and pinpoint how the library could help through outreach and local public service.
- **TECHNOLOGY:** Oversaw the maintenance and development of the library's website. Worked as part of a 9 member rural library system to ensure that all library technology worked and was developed for future growth
- **ANALYTICS:** Developed and adopted an evidence based decision culture with a robust system of data sets to measure library performance and customer satisfaction monthly.
- **BUDGETS & FINANCE:** Developed and managed a \$250K budget along with a seven member Board of Directors. In addition to the yearly budget, I also worked with this board to manage an endowment fund worth \$1 million USD.

- **GENERAL:** Coordinated all library services, programs, and collections for youth ages 12-18 over 4 library sites within the city of Chattanooga, TN.
- **LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT:** Successfully led the project to develop THE 2ND FLOOR, an innovative interactive library space dedicated to discovery & learning that merged traditional library collections with creative maker spaces, learning opportunities, an arcade, and an event space for ages 0-18 and their caregivers. The project proved to be highly successful, having steadily increased library visits and program attendance through the years, culminating with the library surpassing 1 million yearly checkouts in 2017.
- **LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT:** Actively participated as a Senior Manager in the Leadership team setting the vision and operational directions for the library service. Managed a team of 10 employees in their daily operations to have more of a focus on delivering Youth Services programs mixed with traditional library services
- **PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT:** Co-created DEV DEV, a highly successful month long coding and robotics camp for teens. After operating as library program for two consecutive summers, this program was adopted by the Public Education Foundation of Chattanooga and continues to be offered to students and teachers to this day as part of curriculum of Hamilton County Schools.
- **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:** Developed successful partnerships with other departments of the library as well as outside collaborators and businesses that led to an extensive slate of events and initiatives at the library.

- **GENERAL:** Served as the first ever Teen Librarian for the City of Portland, Maine. In this role, I was tasked with developing the overall vision for how the library would provide services to ages 12-18 through their new library space for teens. In my three years as the Teen Librarian the program became proven and strong example of teen librarianship in the field of libraries. This work was recognized by my peers and in 2013 I was awarded the Library Journal Mover & Shakers award as a result of my work.
- **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:** Established and managed relationships with community resources for teenagers including: Portland Police Department, Boys & Girls Club of Southern Maine, and local area high schools.
- **COMMUNITY COLLABORATION:** Worked with local organizations and community members to create high quality and low cost programs for teens. Partners included; the Maine College of Art & Design, Casablanca Comics, The Telling Room, and various local musicians.

- **GENERAL:** Served as the Teen Librarian to ages 12-18 in Cape May County, NJ at 8 library sites,

collaborated with other departments to ensure that general library operations were carried out.

- **LIBRARY EVENTS:** Oversaw all aspects of event development & management as well as library collections for ages 12-18 at one library site.
- **LIBRARY COLLECTIONS:** Purchased materials and maintained library collections for ages 12-18.
- **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:** Established and then coordinated a Teen Advisory Board made up of 10 local teenagers that met bimonthly to discuss, plan, and then carry out work and activities that kept teens engaged in the local library.
- **TECHNOLOGY:** Vinyl Record Preservation: Oversaw digitization and preservation of the children's library vinyl record collection, created a website dedicated to sharing information directed at the local teen population.
- **MARKETING & PROMOTIONS:** Wrote and designed a brochure highlighting the library's policies and services; managed all publicity and advertising done to promote the library services for teens ages 12-18.

## COMMUNITY PROJECTS

- **Gardiner Regional Middle School StoryWalk**, a community based collaboration with the Gardiner Public Library, Maine School Administrative District #11, Healthy Communities of the Capital Area, developed and installed a permanent storywalk at the Gardiner Area Middle School in November 2022. For this project I worked as part of a team to develop, plan, and then install a storywalk that promotes reading and exercise to families in the community. My specific role in the project was to create & implement a structure around how the collaboration works and will continue to work in the future. - **Wellington City Libraries People Counting Project**, a project that focused on the installation and implementation of a unified people counting for all libraries & community centres managed by Wellington City Libraries. For this project I worked directly with Bellwether People Counting Solutions to identify the needs of 20 sites, manage the installation dates, and then install the technology needed to begin this project. Completed in late 2021 and still in use currently, this project gave all Wellington City Libraries sites the technology needed to measure how many visitors they were seeing on a daily basis and then plan their library services accordingly.
- **Lucky Drop Zine Machine at the Waitohi Library**, as part of a partnership with Wellington Zine Fest, The "Lucky Drop" zine machine was located at Waitohi Johnsonville Library between March–September 2021. Featuring zines created by local Wellington, NZ artists and authors, programs & events centering on the creation of zines and events celebrating the zine community were held at the library.
- **Titusville PA Heritage Connection**, an online portal that connects those seeking out historical information about Titusville, PA or genealogical information about their family with the information or local organization in Titusville, PA that would be able to best serve them. This portal was the first of its kind for this region, and since its implementation the site has attracted the attention of those from afar who seek to discover more information about the history of this region and has helped create connections between the library and its users from all around the country. The portal also showcases the library's ever increasing role in building digital capability, collecting the memories of a community, and sharing and celebrating our local stories. - **DEV DEV: summer of code**, a summer code camp for teens that taught teens the basics of programming in Python, HTML, and robotics, created in collaboration with nonprofits engage3D and AIGA Chattanooga and fully funded by the Benwood Foundation. This program ran for two summers (2013–2014) at the Chattanooga Public Library before becoming an official part of the curriculum for Hamilton County teachers through the Public Education Foundation of Chattanooga.

Worked with local artists, community groups, and local businesspeople to bring events and happenings into the community centre space, ensured all bills & mortgages were paid on time, set up the community center space for local groups to use, ran yearly rummage sales to aid in the repair funding, worked out leases with individuals & groups who used the space, & managed the leases so that they were paid on time.
